Welcome back to another Bristol & South Glos Young Carers in Schools e-Bulletin.

Whilst we find ourselves in the third national lock-down, I continue to be impressed by the level of commitment given to young carers, with so many schools ensuring young carers are offered a place as part of the vulnerable pupils group and for those who cannot be in schools, giving regular check-ins and even online groups, it makes such a difference.

New Schools

13 new schools have joined YCiS since the last bulletin, taking the number of YCiS schools across the region to 82. Participating schools can be viewed <u>here</u>.

Young Carers in Schools Awards

Well done to <u>Knowle DGE</u> who have achieved their Bronze Award creating support within the school to identify and support young carters, including young carer leads, accessible information for pupils, staff and families and a young carers peer support group. This is a fantastic achievement on their first anniversary of being in the programme.

<u>Barley Close Primary School</u> has been awarded the Young Carers in School Silver Award, a huge congratulations to Alison and her team for this amazing accomplishment. This is also a first for Bristol and South Gloucestershire we are very proud.

The Silver Award asks schools to implement multi-agency support to ensure young carers have access to appropriate support both within school and out of school. Schools are asked to demonstrate evidence of assemblies, staff training, partnership working and that attendance and attainment of young carers is monitored.

Young Carers Service Update

In November we welcomed Joss Tagg, as the new Young Carers Service Manager, having worked for several voluntary sector and young person focussed organisations including Brook and Voscur Joss brings a wealth of experience and we are delighted to have her on board.

We are continuing to offer support to young carers in Bristol & South Glos remotely. Read our full statement <u>here</u>.

Thank you for your referrals, we continue to get a constant flow. The challenge working under COVID-19 is undertaking assessments online. We are looking for your support where young carers are attending schools and there is a difficulty in undertaking the assessment following a referral. When needed we will ask schools to support young carers to engage in a zoom assessment with one of our key workers. This helps to get a support plan in place sooner.

Young Carers Voice

The local Young Carers Voice group have raised a number of concerns including increased stress and mental health issues as a result of the pandemic and being educated at home. Due to living with people who are vulnerable to COVID many are having to stay at home, where they may experience additional issues to undertake their education due to pressures of their caring role. Young Carers Voice want to make sure schools are aware of the added complications they face and would like schools to check in with them more regularly at home to see if they need support. They are also concerned that there is not a plan for the taking of exams and this uncertainty raises anxiety levels.

Young Carers Voice have started to plan their actions for 2021, more news to follow at the Network meeting!



This year's theme is: **Protect Young Carers' Futures**. The day will focus on Young Carers futures, highlighting the incredible skills they have developed through being a Carer.

Young Carers are asking for action and for more to be done to make sure their skills count.
