Transition



We all know how important it is to help pupils make the change from primary to secondary phase. Our Year 6 – Year 7 transition days will take place this year on Wednesday 2^{nd} and Thursday 3^{rd} of July. We are aware that some children (from BLC and from other primary schools) will be on camp on those dates, so we have planned additional transition events for those pupils on a different day.

Making sure children are happy as they join our nursery and as they move from nursery into reception is even more important. For this reason, we hold a longer transition process (including home visits) in September to help children feel settled, but also to help parents and carers to join in and support their children's Early Years education.

Please do read through the letters that we send about transition and do all you can to get involved in these events. Research shows that children whose families are engaged in their education are more likely to:

- score higher on tests and achieve better grades
- continue to study in post-16 colleges and universities;
- develop self-confidence and motivation in the classroom; and
- have better social skills and classroom behaviour.
